**RE:** Caldor Recovery Update

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Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Caldor Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

### Environmental Management

- **Alternate Program** – No changes from previous week
  - 5221 Butte Creek Road- All cleanup activities and sampling have been completed. EMD is waiting on the Final Summary Report, based on email communications there seems to be a money issue between the contractor and subcontractor that are delaying this.

### Land Use

- **Fee Waivers** – 158 received - No changes from previous week
  - Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
    - 102 Received
    - 119 Approved (even if they didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for a fee waiver, TRV/TMH permit fees are included in the approved waiver along with the requested permit fees to avoid the need for additional fee waiver requests/approval should the need the TRV/TMH permit)
- **Single Family Home Rebuild Permits** – 85 received – No change in total # of permits.
  - Replacement Home Permits – 71 received, 50 issued, 21 pending
  - Home Repair Permits – 10 received, 3 issued, 7 pending - No changes from previous week
  - Convert Mobile Home to Permanent Permits – 4 received, 3 issued, 1 pending - No changes from previous week
- **TRV Permits** – 56 Received - No changes from previous week
  - 45 Issued
  - 11 Pending

### Health and Human Services Agency

- **Long-Term Recovery**

- **Immediate Needs**
  - No update
- **Social Services – No changes from previous week**
  - Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP): This program assists people experiencing or at risk of homelessness who are likely eligible for disability benefits by providing advocacy for disability benefits as well as housing supports. The housing supports this program offers includes interim shelter assistance, rental assistance, housing navigation, case management, security deposits, utility payments, moving costs, legal services, and credit repair.
    - Referrals 8
      - 7 were referred by the Salvation Army Disaster Case Managers (DCMs) and 1 the Social Worker (SW) met at Project Room Key
    - Pending: 0
      - There are no new applications for the SW to review
    - Not eligible for the program: 6
      - 5 did not qualify and 1 stopped responding to us
    - Clients receiving HDAP assistance: 2
      - 1 is housed. We are assisting the other client with their social security application, but they are not interested in the housing options we have offered.
  - Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA): This program is targeted to individuals and their household members with income at or below 60% of the Area Median Income. It provides eligible residents with payments to make up the difference between the amount a household can afford to pay for monthly rent and utilities and the actual cost of the housing selected by the household. Preference is given to eligible applicants who were displaced from their residence due to the Caldor Fire and are still experiencing housing instability.
    - Referrals: 8
      - All 8 were referred by the DCMs
    - Pending: 5
      - 5 are being evaluated for eligibility
    - Not eligible for the program: 3
      - 1 is no longer responding us and 1 has not submitted the TBRA application
    - Clients receiving TBRA assistance: 0
- **Behavioral Health**
  - Support Groups: 53 groups, 70 attendees
    - May 27, 2023 Paint Together support group had one returning survivor attend.
    - Please see attached flyers for June support groups.
  - Access: This division within Behavioral Health reviews new applications for eligibility to Behavioral Health services. The Mental Health Worker receives applications for Behavioral Health services from survivors and sends these to the Access team to review.
 

No changes from previous week

    - Referrals: 6
      - 1 survivor was referred to us by a community member and 5 referred by the West Slope Foundation
    - Pending: 0
      - There are no new applications for the Mental Health Worker to review
    - Not eligible for the program: 5

- 5 did not have Medi-Cal and therefore were not eligible for Behavioral Health services. 4 were referred to New Morning Youth and Family Services for free counseling and the West Slope Foundation paid for 1 person's private counseling appointments until they were able to get an appointment with their private insurance.
- Clients Eligible for Behavioral Services: 1
  - Behavioral Health Worker has found 1 client eligible for BH services
