Environmental Management

Alternate Program

o 3 parcels outstanding

• USFS Parcels

- 162 Debris removal complete (96%)
- 111 Soil samples approved (66%)
- 84 Erosion Control Complete (50%)
- 69 completed ROE sign-off (returned to owner)

• Public Program

- No changes from the previous week. Complete
- USPS Grizzly Flats
 - USPS filed a workplan on 9/8/2022 and its alternate program application is pending.

Land Use

- Fee Waivers 96 received
 - o Temporary Mobile Homes/Temporary Recreational Vehicles
 - 56 Received
 - 60 Approved (even if parcel owners didn't request a TRV/TMH but were eligible for temporary power and demo permit, we included TRV/TMH in the initial approval in case of future need)

 - o 21 Building Permits Issued w/out Permit Fees Waived

- Social Worker
 - Caldor Social Worker had a productive meeting with the Salvation Army Disaster Case Managers (DCM) last Friday. The DCMs will be sending them two referrals and evaluating one of the referrals for Housing Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP).
 - A Caldor family that had lost contact with the Social Worker was recently reconnected, and they were enrolled into the HDAP program which will provide rental assistance and disability advocacy services.
 - The Staff attended the Pioneer Park Community Center today from 1:00pm 3:00pm to provide assistance to survivors.

• Mental Health Worker

- The Caldor Mental Health Worker continues to offer support groups for Caldor survivors, including going to Grizzly Flats door to door to inform survivors about the support groups. They will be doing more outreach like this in the future.
- They are reaching out to more county staff to help inform the community about the support groups.
