Medication Profile

Atrovent (Duoneb)

(Ipatropium Bromide + Albuterol Sulfate "DuoNeb Pillow)

<u>Class</u>:

Parasympathetic blocker (Anticholinergic), Bronchodilator

Action:

Dilates bronchioles and decreases respiratory tract secretions. Inhibits parasympathetic stimulation by blocking acetylcholine receptors. Anticholinergics prevent the increase of cyclic guanosine monophosphate which is caused by interaction of acytecholine with the muscarinic receptor on bronchial smooth muscle

Onset: 5 minutes

Peak: 15 minutes

Duration: 2-4 hours

Adult Administration:

0.5mg premixed with 2.5mg albuterol (3ml total solution) via nebulizer (Single dose only)

Pediatric Administration:

0.5mg premixed with 2.5mg albuterol (3ml total solution) via nebulizer (Single dose only)

Indications:

Contraindications:

None

Asthma COPD Allergic reaction Bronchospasm

Side Effects:

CV: Hypotension, bradycardia arrhythmias, cardiac arrest, venous thrombosis CNS: Headache, confusion, psychosis, brain cell injury GI: Nausea, vomiting, anorexia MS: Joint pain GU: Polyuria

Pregnancy:

Category C

Notes:

- IV line must be flushed between Calcium Chloride and Sodium Bicarbonate to avoid precipitation.
- Observe IV site closely. Extravasation may result in tissue necrosis. Slow IV push.
