# **Medication Profile**

**Glucose** (Oral Glucose)

<u>Class</u>:

Monosaccharide Carbohydrate

# Action:

After absorption from GI tract, glucose is distributed in the tissues and provides a rapid increase in circulating blood sugar.

Onset: 5-10 minutes

Peak: Variable

Duration: Variable

### Adult Administration:

15 Grams PO. May repeat if no response and IV dextrose is not available.

### Pediatric Administration:

15 Grams PO. May repeat if no response and IV dextrose is not available.

Indications:

Contraindications:

Suspected or known Hypoglycemia

Patient unable to follow commands

# Side Effects:

Nausea/Vomiting Aspiration Hyperglycemia

# Pregnancy:

Category A

# Notes:

Not a substitute for IV dextrose in extreme cases of hypoglycemia (BS less than 40) unless IV access is unobtainable.
