NAUSEA - ADULT

Basic Life Support

EMT

ROUTINE CARE

- Monitor Vital Signs, Assess airway, and support ventilation with appropriate airway adjuncts as indicated.
- Apply oxygen if pulse oximetry <94% or signs of hypoperfusion or respiratory distress

Advanced Life Support

Paramedic

CARDIAC MONITOR – as indicated

VASCULAR ACCESS – IV/IO

ONDANSETRON – 4 mg IV/IO/ODT, slow IV (over 1 minute) and may repeat x 1 in 5 minutes prn

DIPHENHYDRAMINE - 25 mg slow IV/IO. Repeat once prn

NAUSEA – PEDIATRIC

Basic Life Support

ROUTINE CARE

- Monitor Vital Signs, Assess airway, and support ventilation with appropriate airway adjuncts as indicated.
- Apply oxygen if pulse oximetry <94% or signs of hypoperfusion or respiratory distress

Advanced Life Support

Paramedic

CARDIAC MONITOR – As indicated

VASCULAR ACCESS - IV/IO

DIPHENHYDRAMINE - 0.1mg/kg slow IV/IO

ONDANSETRON

Age \geq 4 years (>34 kg):

4 mg IM/IO/IV/ODT (IV over 60 seconds or more*).

May repeat once in 10 minutes.

Age 1- 4 years:

2 mg IM/IO/IV/ODT (IV over 60 seconds or more*).

May repeat once in 10 minutes.

Pill splitter is required for 2 mg ODT dose in pediatrics.

When administering IV it is critical to administer **SLOWLY** to avoid profound hypotension.
