# III. CHAIRMAN REPORT: (David Brazzel, M.D.)

Presentation: Arianna Sampson, PA-C, from Marshall Hospital provided an overview of the CA Bridge Program. This program focuses on opioid use disorder and the treatment provided for successful outcomes. The bridges program at Marshall had 119 patients treated in 2019 with a 97% follow up rate and now there are over 50 hospitals state wide that have access points for patients with substance abuse disorders. # A. BARTON MEMORIAL HOSPITAL (BMH): (Corey McLeod, M.D.)

 <u>COVID-19 Paramedic Alert:</u> Barton had questions about a release at scene vs AMA for suspected COVID-19 patients as the CDC was recommending management at home. EMS will develop a policy for those with the suspected virus and send out a Paramedic update. # V. <u>EMS AGENCY REPORT:</u> (Chad Cossey)

- <u>Field Care Audits:</u> The EMS agency would like to start using a FCA model and is looking for buy in to assist with determining outcomes, team building, and potentially reduce scene time. These audits would be approximately four hours and include recorded call review as well. The outcomes of these audits would then be brought to MAC for a final review and any further recommendations.
- Corona Virus: EMS is updating the EMD to include international travel or flu symptoms. PPE is on back order for months but crews are encouraged to use masks on all suspected corona virus patients. Medic crews are currently not being quarantined for suspected cases. As of 3/11/2020 there are currently no cases in EDC but we recommend crews minimize risk and if you are feeling sick, stay home.

- <u>CCT Documentation:</u> There has been some confusion regarding the required documentation for CCT transports. Please note, All CCT transports **MUST HAVE** specific narrative descriptions of what specialty service the patient is going to be receiving at the higher level facility **AND** what specifically the nurse is monitoring or managing outside paramedic scope. An example would be "Patient on a heparin drip or Patient on a vent monitored by RN, Michelle". Without this required information, your tags will be returned for completion.
- Costs for Service: We have received an influx in patient complaints regarding conversations relative to cost of service. Please refrain from discussing costs, insurance coverage, free services, or discounts. Patients have been given incorrect information from field providers, which in turn cause issues for our office staff. It also creates a trust issue within the community. Refer all questions relative to finances to EMS. Thank you!
