Topic: Critical Medication Shortage Guidelines

Effective: Immediately

Attention: All EDC Paramedics and Base Hospital Personnel

As you are probably already aware, there is a nationwide shortage of Dextrose (D50 and D25) and Magnesium Sulfate. This situation will most likely continue for an indefinite period of time, so it is important that we have a plan in place. Until further notice, please use the following guidelines:

D50/D25:

- 1. Do not dispose of any expired D50/D25 until the shortage has ended. It may be necessary to utilize these at a later date, pending State EMS Authority approval. <u>DO NOT USE EXPIRED D50 AT THIS TIME</u>.
- 2. For D50: Providers may implement and utilize 250 mL of D10 to supply 25g of dextrose. (1-250 mL bag = 25g of D50).
- 3. For D25: Providers may implement and utilize D10 at 5ml/kg for pediatric patients. (Neonates 2 ml/kg)

Mag Sulfate:

- 1. Shift all extra supplies of mag sulfate from ALS engines to the ambulances. It is permissible for an ALS engine to not carry mag sulfate at this time.
- 2. Save all expired vials of manufactured (not locally compounded) mag sulfate for possible use in an emergency situation.
