David Zelinsky, Service Officer, has served over 1230 Veterans over the last 10 years.

About half needed advice, and about half needed financial help.

While working on this form, I took a phone call from a Veteran who used a toll free phone number I gave him, and got enrolled in VA health care.

He also is utilizing walk in day at the county VSO, and is working on getting service connected disability benefits.

We will also have to pay for his truck repairs, or repairs on a donated truck. Either way, the order of magnitude is \$2000-\$3000.

How will this grant address this need?

Money does not solve all problems, but it solves some.

See above for an example.

Recently, I kept a Veteran in his mobile home park by paying \$300 of rent he could not cover.

A couple times in the last year, I met moms with babes in arms, at Walmart, to pay the PG&E bill. The lights came back on!

How are you suited to meet this need?

The Legion is the biggest Veterans organization in El Dorado County, and has strong support organizations, such as the Riders, Sons and Auxiliary.

Service Officer Zelinsky has served over 1230 Veterans, over ten years.

What is the grant timeline and what are the major milestones?

It is anticipated that the money will be spent within the year from receipt.

Every life helped is a life saved.

It never seems anything other than existential when doing this work.

What is the anticipated impact of the project?

Once again, life saving and transforming.

Instead of living in 60 degrees in the winter, a working propane heater!

How will you measure the results of the project?

It is not a matter of saving 20 lives is a failure, and only 40 is good enough.

While 20-40 Veterans, widows, and families is a reasonable range of how many will in fact be served, the goal is to be good stewards, and transform lives.

We work collaboratively with all of the other organizations serving local Veterans.

Many eyes. Many filters. More wisdom.

For example, just learned this week about HISA grants from Commander Mac, VFW Post 10165, Tim Whalen, Military Family Support Group and Citrus Heights Vet Center, Larry Nunez, Victory Village, and Jon Brown, VSO.

Now that is collaboration!

That knowledge will help manage some remodeling and repair requests that just came through from El Dorado Veterans Resource Center.

Referrals typically come from VA social workers, such as HUD-VASH, Only Kindness, which has a system called Squares for VA verification, and El Dorado Veterans Resource Center, which works with the county VSO to verify Veteran status.

Another example:

If in working with a VA provider, such as a Grant per Diem provider like Victory Village, they have verified that the Veteran is eligible for GPD, then it will be ok to pay for a motel to house the Veteran, until the GPD provider is ready to house them.

If, in a rare case, gas has to be bought now, then a VA health care card with photo ID, or some equivalent would be required, or a DD-214, with picture ID.

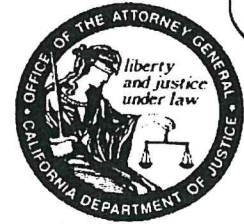
