

Section 4_Framing

- Strategy through the lens of water resource management that is mindful of statewide and national trends
 - Locally-grounded perspective
 - Tangible outcomes to improve conditions of water resources management (see Section 3)
 - Integrated considerations that recognize connectivity among management of different resources [organization is more a convenient matter but not absolute]
 - Collective efforts by the County and its water resource management agencies, weighted more on what may be missing or largely deficient where attention would be warranted

A point of clarification:

The WRDMP is a document that can help clarify the advocacy position for the County as a whole, but it is not a document for advocacy purposes.








